



## 2019 Golden Radish Award Criteria for School Districts and LEAs of 51 or More Schools

<p>Awards will be given to districts/LEAs satisfying <b>at least 7 of the 10 criteria</b> at a given level. For example, Gold Awards will be given to LEAs that satisfy at least 7 of the 10 Gold level criteria. However, an LEA that satisfies 6 of the 10 Gold level criteria and an additional 1 criteria at the Silver level will be awarded a Silver Award.</p> <p><b>*Districts/LEAs that satisfy at least 1 criterion within the Bronze level or higher will receive an Honorary Award. *</b></p> <p><b>*Districts/LEAs that satisfy all 10 criterion within the Gold level will receive a Platinum Award.*</b></p>	RECOGNITION LEVEL
